

Cold aisle size parameters for edge computing



Overview

Aisle space - Provide adequate room at the front and back of cabinets and racks to allow unobstructed servicing of the systems and clear passage for personnel. Cold aisle containment (CAC) is a proven data center cooling strategy that creates physical barriers around cold air supply zones, preventing contamination from hot exhaust air and eliminating the energy-wasting effects of air mixing. This approach transforms traditional hot aisle/cold aisle. More frequently, data centers are using hot and/or cold aisle cooling containment solutions to help with managing airflow, eliminating hot spots and improving energy efficiency. Restricted Aisle Length: If one end of the aisle is closed off or lacks a personnel exit, the maximum aisle length should be limited to 6 meters for safe access and evacuation. The high sensitivity of electronic components in such facilities requires that temperature, humidity, air movement and air cleanliness must be kept. mentation of hot aisle/cold aisle containment.
