In today's headlines, African Telecoms giant Seacom announced that it will be laying fiber optic broadband cables in the coming year in three African nations: Burundi, Somalia, and Southern Sudan. Fiber optic technology has revolutionized telecommunications by providing higher bandwidth, faster internet speeds, and more reliable connections compared to traditional copper networks. While submarine communications cables are used to connect countries and continents to the Internet, terrestrial fibre optic cables are used to extend this connectivity to landlocked countries or to urban centers within a country.
