

Neutral line inside the distribution box



Overview

The neutral wire's designated termination point inside the service panel is the neutral bus bar, a long, thick metallic strip designed to handle the combined return current from all connected circuits. It is the critical interface where the utility's power is divided into individual branch circuits that feed the lights, outlets, and appliances. The neutral line refers to the part of the distribution grid that returns the power that left the transmission lines through a hot line or phase line to do work on an electrical load. Neutral lines are at zero potential relative to the ground, meaning that ideally, they do not pose a shock hazard. In a typical North American home, the power delivered to your breaker box is split into two “hot” wires, L1 (Line 1) and L2 (Line 2). Each of these lines carries 120 volts of alternating current (AC) and is connected to its own bus bar inside the breaker box. And all the switching and protective devices are installed in the distribution box. Single Phase Distribution Box generally consists of Double Pole MCBs, Single Pole MCBs, and RCCBs. Your breaker box wiring includes three main wire types: black hot wires carry electricity to outlets, white neutral wires return unused power, and green ground wires prevent electrocution.
