Overview

A fiber splice tray is typically a tray or panel with slots or compartments where individual fiber optic cables can be neatly arranged and spliced together. The rule is to coil the fiber once after each splicing and heat shrinking of one or several optical fibers in fiber optic sleeve or optical fibers in a branch direction optical cable.

Advantages: It avoids the confusion of optical fibers between fiber protection sleeve or between different branch. Fiber cable splicing is a critical step in building reliable fiber optic networks. Reducing the splicing loss at the connections can enhance the transmission distance of fiber optic.
